



교육 정책 효과성 분석

- 1) 교육 효과
 - Graduation rate + literacy rate
 - Intergenerational effect
 - Head Start in the US (Barr and Gibbs, 2018; Kose, 2019), Medicaid in the US (East et al., 2017), compulsory education in Germany, Sweden and Taiwan (Chou et al., 2010; Huebener, 2017; Lundborg et al., 2014), and preschool in Denmark (Rossin-Slater and Wu "st, 2018).
 - Mother's effect + on girls and boys
 - Father's effect + on girls
 - * 자녀 성별 구성 (girls / boys / g & b)
 - 농촌 거주 학생들 + effect
 - * Among districts below average income level
 - Child labor

Figure 2.4 Lower-income countries are rapidly expanding secondary education at a time when much of their population has not yet completed primary school


Evolution in the stock of educational attainment (ages 15-64), by present-day income group (1890-2010)






■ 2) mechanism – 보건 효과

 (6.384) / 2008 (5.632)
- Child mortality
 - * under 5 or under 18?
 - * Infant mortality?

교육 정책 효과성 분석

- 3) mechanism 사회/경제적 효과
 - Marital outcome: 조혼, 결혼 연령, 출산 연령
 - 말라위 거주 18세 미만 여아 중의 42%가 결혼을 하며, 15세 미만 여아 중 9%가 결혼을 함 (UNICEF, 2020)
 - Spousal quality
 - 교육 이수 정도에 따라서 배우자의 교육 수준
 - Labor market & hh wealth
 - Asset ownership, wage employment




In Malawi, large classes are a common sight. "The average ratio is **one teacher to 73 learners**," says Rabson Madi, an educational planner from the Ministry of Education in Malawi, "while a big class can have as many as 120 learners for one teacher." (UNESCO, 2020)

Primary school completion rate, 2020

The primary completion rate is the number of new entrants (enrollments minus repeaters) in the last grade of primary education, regardless of age, divided by the population at the entrance age for the last grade of primary education.
